

Marina Aquatic Center Sailing Club Policies

As a member in good standing with the UCLA MAC Sailing Club I agree to abide by the Club rules and regulations as well as the rules and regulations of UCLA Marina Aquatic Center — which have been provided to me. I understand that UCLA Marina Aquatic Center reserves the right to modify these rules from time to time and that it is my responsibility as a member to be aware of such changes. A current set of rules and regulations to which I may refer are available at the Marina Aquatic Center.

Facility:

1. Weekend parking is very limited. Be prepared to park off site. Parking privileges for members may be revoked at any time.
2. Drive slowly to and from the facility. Take care when backing out of parking spots. Yield to bikes and pedestrians.
3. Check the website (marinaaquaticcenter.org) for current open times for the UCLA Marina Aquatic Center.

Equipment Use:

1. Members may only use equipment that they have qualified on through a class or Skills Evaluation.
2. Skippers are expected to thoroughly inspect their vessel, sails and related equipment to ensure that everything is in proper working order. If in doubt about the condition of a particular piece of equipment or vessel they should consult the Dockmaster and, if necessary, use alternative equipment or vessel.
3. All equipment needing repair shall be reported immediately.
4. No member shall attempt to fix or make rigging adjustments to equipment without prior approval from the Program Coordinator or Maintenance Supervisor.
5. Members are financially responsible for any damage caused due to negligence. This may include cost of repair or replacement of damaged or missing equipment.

Equipment Care:

1. All equipment should be thoroughly washed and dried before putting it away. This includes the hull, deck, mast, boom, daggerboards, rudders, tillers and other rigging.
2. Sails must be properly folded or rolled as appropriate for their type and stowed in the correct number sail bag before being placed in the correct spot of the sail rack.
3. Sails that have been wet with salt water should be thoroughly rinsed with fresh water and allowed to dry as much as practical before putting them away. Sails should not be left up to flog dry in the wind.
4. Vessels should never be left unattended in the water on the windward side of the dock.

Policies:

1. Members may take regularly scheduled Sailing classes at 50% off. Affiliation levels apply so a Student would pay 50% of the Student/ Recreation Member price for a class while a Community Affiliate would pay 50% of the Community Affiliate price and so on.
2. The 50% discount does not apply to private lessons or skills evaluations.
3. Availability of vessels is subject to class demands, private lessons and is on a 'first-come, first-served' basis. Vessels cannot be reserved.
4. No water activities are permitted when there is thunder and lightning or other hazardous weather conditions. Please note the UCLA Marina Aquatic Center water quality policies.
5. Sailing may be cancelled or delayed in the event of fog or high wind or other environmental conditions.
6. The Dockmaster may, in his or her sole judgment, further restrict sailing by limiting the sailing area, limit the equipment and/or sails used or by any other means that they feel is appropriate to maintain the safety of participants and equipment in the given conditions.

Miscellaneous

1. Note that recycling containers are located near the locker rooms and picnic area.
2. Excessive noise should be avoided during the early morning and nighttime.
3. Report all injuries and equipment damage to the Dockmaster.
4. Always wear shoes while at the facility.
